Guidance notes for completing the form

Section 2 Grassland and other land

G1: Grassland sown in the last 5 years

All temporary grass or grass sown within the past 5 years. Include wildflower meadows and pollen & nectar mixes.

G2: Other grassland (including permanent pasture)

All grass over 5 years old. Permanent pasture and land used for grazing. Environmental scheme land that does not fit into any other category should also be included.

G5: Sole right rough grazing

Only include land that you own or have sole rights to. Exclude common grazing land that you use. Examples of rough grazing land are heathland, moors, mountains or hills. Land for outdoor pigs should be included in G15.

G14: Woodland

Include woodland used for grazing and land in a woodland scheme. Exclude orchards which should be included in Section 3 (horticulture). Include short rotation coppice (SRC) in A33.

G17: Other non-agricultural land

Include land not accounted for elsewhere on the form e.g. marshes, yards, tracks.

Section 3 Crops and fallow land

Land previously declared as set-aside, or currently in schemes such as ELS, should be entered in the category which best identifies the land cover on 1 June 2010.

If possible, exclude field margins/conservation headlands/ buffer zones from the area of the crop. The margins around a field should be included under its current use (usually in the grassland section or in A32 as GAEC 12 land).

A5: Mixed Grain

Include mixtures of grain crops with other grain or peas, beans, etc. sown together and intended for combining.

A19: Root crops, brassicas and fodder beet for stockfeeding

Include turnips, swedes, mangolds, kale, cabbage, kohlrabi and rape.

Exclude crops for human consumption (e.g. swedes and turnips). These should be included in B21 (all other vegetables and salad) in Section 4 (Horticulture).

A18: All other crops for stock feeding

Exclude peas for harvesting dry and maize. These should be included in A22 (peas for harvesting dry) and A23 (maize) respectively. Leguminous forage crops such as lucerne and lupins should be included in A14.

A35: Crops for aromatic or medicinal use

e.g. poppies, lavender, chamomile. Plants or parts of plants for pharmaceutical purposes, perfume manufacture or other aromatic products. Generally they are not sold directly for consumption because they need to be industrially processed prior to final use.

A31: All other crops (not vegetables)

All other non-horticultural crops e.g. flax, hops. Vegetables should be provided in Section 4 (Horticulture) Lavender should be provided in A35.

A32: Bare Fallow and GAEC12 land

Include all arable land not in production, including GAEC12 land, wild bird /game cover and game strips.

R14: Irrigation

If you intend to irrigate your **outdoor** crops (arable or horticultural) as a matter of course, or as necessary in case of a prolonged dry period, please tick this box.

Section 4 Horticulture

Orchards

Grazed orchards should be included in this section, not as grassland.

C1: Commercial orchards

Include any orchards from which you intend to sell fruit commercially, either direct for human consumption, or for further processing eg. for cider.

B15: Culinary plants (including herbs) for human consumption

Culinary plants are distinguished from vegetables in that they are used in small amounts and provide flavour rather than substance to food.

B21: All other veg & salad for human consumption

This includes carrots, cauliflowers etc. Indoor mushrooms should be reported under F11 (Glasshouse & protected crops). Exclude potatoes, which should be included in A10 or A11 in Section 3 (Crops).

Female sheep not previously used for breeding but that have been or will be put to the ram this year.

P10: All farmed deer

Deer kept for breeding, meat or other foodstuffs, skins or other by-products, or as breeding stock for these purposes.

Other Livestock

Please note, cattle should not be recorded anywhere on this form.

Section 6: People working on the holding on 1 June 2010

Remember to include yourself in one of the categories (generally in Q101 or Q102 - principal farmers).

Include paid & unpaid workers and regular employees who are **usually** on your holding on survey day. Managerial, supervisory & office workers are included.

Please exclude equestrian workers, grooms, **workers involved solely in diversification activities**, gamekeepers, sales assistants/ farm shop workers, domestic staff and workers on capital investments (i.e. on new buildings).

Q134 & Q135: Regular workers

excluded.

Family and non-family workers who are employed for more than 20 weeks of the year.

Please include contract labour which you employ for **most** of the year (even if they are on another holding on survey day). Contract labour not used for most of the year should be

Q109 & Q110: Casual & Gang workers

Family and non-family workers who are usually employed for less than 20 weeks of the year and are employed on survey day.

Please include youth trainees on official schemes and Seasonal Agricultural Workers Scheme (SAWS) workers.

Section 7 Responsibility for the holding

Section 7A. Providing your labour and diversification data

If you choose option 3, please record the CPH numbers of the holdings in the box shown. Within section 7 to 11 you will need to account for all persons working on the holdings indicated. If there are several people managing these holdings, you will still need to choose only one to be the 'principal manager'.

Section 7B. Legal and financial responsibility for the holding

This may be the owner or a tenant.

Section 7C, 7D and 7E. Principal holder, principal holder's spouse, principal manager

Full working year - for the purposes of this survey, a full working year is equivalent to working 39 hours a week (or more) over 12 months. The other categories are based on a proportion of this period. For example:

39 hours a week over 6 months = $\frac{1}{2}$ working year 10 hours a week over 12 months = $\frac{1}{4}$ working year

Section 8 Family workers

Please include **all** workers (aged 16 and above) that are a member of the principal holder's family, whether working regularly (full or part time) or casually/seasonally.

Full working year - this is defined under Section 7 above.

Farm work include all agricultural/horticultural activities on the holding and the preparation of its produce for market. It should include <u>managerial and office work</u>. Diversification activities are defined as 'other paid work'.

Other paid work includes any activity or occupation for payment of money or kind. It includes non farm work **OFF** the holding, non farm work **ON** the holding (such as tourism or other diversification activities), and farm work **ON ANOTHER** holding.

If the other paid work occupies exactly the same amount of time as the farm work on the holding, answer on the basis that less time is spent on other paid work.

Other paid work *relates directly to the holding* if it involves the resources of the holding (area, buildings, machinery, etc.) or its products.

Section 9 Non family regular workers

Please include workers that are:

- not a member of the principal holder's family and
- employed regularly (full time or part-time).

If the holding is run by an organisation, all regular workers should be included in this section.

For descriptions of a 'full working year', 'farm work', 'other paid work' see the guidance notes for Section 8 above.

Section 10 Casual labour

Include casual/seasonal workers employed by the holding. Exclude workers that are related to the principal holder, they should be included in section 8.

Section 11 Contract labour

Include self-employed workers and workers employed by a third party e.g. gang workers.

Section 12 Diversification

Include commercial activities that are directly related to the holding i.e. activities where the resources of the holding (area, buildings, machinery, etc.) or its products are used.

Exclude pure financial investments, or renting out the land for diverse activities where there is no further involvement in these activities.

Exclude commercial activity on the holding which is not linked to any agricultural/horticultural activity (for example a hairdresser, an insurance company etc.).

Any occasional diversification activities should be excluded.
