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Your tasks:

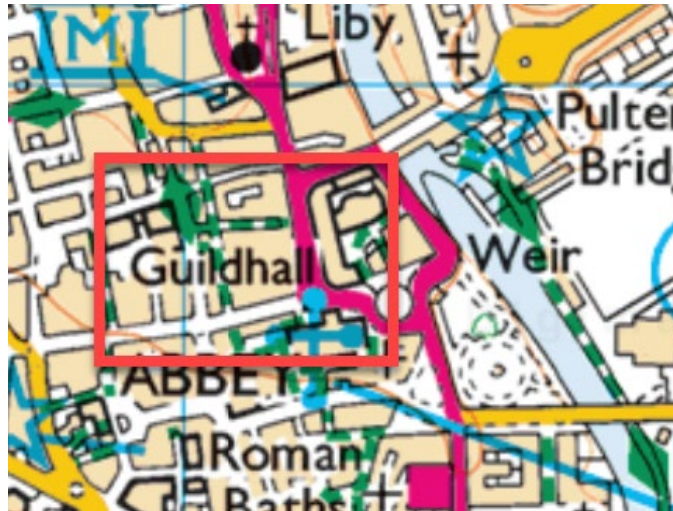
1. Try and view a map on screen that resembles the map in the above image.
2. Find out which Ordnance Survey map you are viewing and the date it was published.

Tips:

- **Location** – the map image is of the city centre of **Bath**, in Somerset.
- **Scale** – keep zooming in to get the same detail shown on the map image.
- **Basemap** – to match the style of the map image, try selecting a different basemap.
- **Map Content** - in the map image, we have removed the **Paths, steps and tracks** features. Can you find the **Map Content** panel in the sidebar and do the same?
- **Map Information** – check this area in the sidebar to find out details of the OS map you are viewing.

Steps:

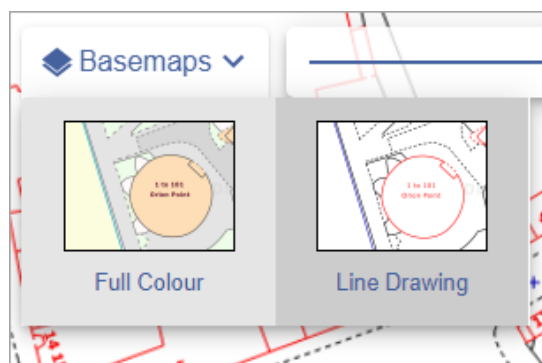
1. Search for Bath. Select Bath (Bath and North-East Somerset).
2. Zoom in on the Guild Hall.



3. Zoom until you see the detailed building outlines. Look for a scale of 20m in the bottom right of the map window.



4. Select **Basemap** Line Drawing.



5. Open the **Map Content** menu. Uncheck the box next to Boundaries.
6. Open **Map Information** – the map product is OS MasterMap®.
